<b>Course Description</b>	This course presents basic principles in organic- and bio-chemistry with emphasis on structure & bonding, chemical reactivity and mechanism.

<b>Homework</b>	Work the problems found in the text. They will not be graded, but working these problems will greatly facilitate your understanding of the course material. (See “How to do well”, below)
<b>Exams</b>	There will be three in-class exams (100 points each) and an in-class final exam (100 points). Your lowest exam grade will be dropped in calculating your grade, which will be based on a total of 300 possible course points.
